As tension rises in French North Africa, France arms her Algerian supporters for defence against robal raids. Voterans of two world were are emong the volunteers. The Profest of Gran province, Monsiour Loubert, personally hands weepons to Moslem recruits at Medrems, where hundreds are being enrolled deally.

Algeria is not France's only problem. In French Moscoco, robel reiders attack villages and suspects in the lenely Marmoucha mountains.

Here, too, level troops fight alongside the French. General Beyor de la Tour talks with some who have repelled a night-reid. Artillery is rushed to the mountains to pursue the robels and many surrender.

The Spanish Moreocan frontier is nearby; this adds to the French difficulties, because Berber tribeamen escape over it after their lightning raids, and the punitive units cannot follow them.

But when the generalla bands stay to fight it out, or are surrounded before they can escape to the frontier, retribution is smift.
