

SCOTLAND v. WALES.

Wales, (in striped shorts) kick off against Scotland at Hampden Park, three weeks after defeating England at Cardiff. But Scotland take charge of the game from the start. Bobbie Collins, inside left, passes to the other Bobbie - inside right Johnstone.

Gordon Smith's shot at the Welsh goal rebounds, and he passes to Johnstone - who slams it home!

Scotland one, Wales nil - and against a crumbling Welsh defence Scotland are soon sweeping forward again. Johnstone to Reilly who heads it in - but he was offside, and it's disallowed. Goalie Jack Kelsey is hurt in the collision with Reilly, but after attention he plays on.

Scotland are soon attacking again. Outside right Gordon Smith gets the ball, and centres.

Most of the Scottish eleven seem to be in front of the Welsh goal. A quick scramble, and inside right Bobbie Johnstone grabs the chance to land his second goal!

Half time and it's Scotland two, Wales nil. Hardly a sign of the old Welsh spirit yet, except for goalie Kelsey and centre-half John Charles who is now leading a Welsh attack. He passes ahead to Trevor Ford at centre-forward. But this brief effort is stopped by Scottish right-back Parker.

Another Scottish offensive, led by the tireless Johnstone. He passes to right half Evans, who shoots, but it's over the bar.

Scotland takes a corner. Kelsey jumps to clear; Go goes to Johnstone but the Welsh backs are there to save.

Scotland keeps up the pressure, but the score stays at two-nil. And it might well have been six-nil, without the brilliant work of the hero of the match - Welsh goalkeeper Jack Kelsey.
