Birmingham Civil Defence force parades past the Director-General of Civil Defence, General Sir Sidney Kirkman. The occasion's the spening of their new headquarters, which the Mayer of Birmingham is now inspecting. This is Britain's first combined control centre for sperating all C.D. services, including fire, police, and ambulance, in an atomic war.

This underground nerve centre is a 2,500-ton cencrete shell, reinforced by 75 tons of steel. It took 20 months to build, and cost £30,000. Seventy-five people can work and live there, protected from radio-activity by a special air filtering plant.

General Kirkman inspects the mobile forces which the new centre has at its disposal. If atomic warfare come to Britain, these are the men and women who would have to fight its results. They hope that time will never eoms; but if it should, they are ready.
