

SINGAPORE MINISTER ARRIVES.

Mr. David Marshall, Chief Minister of Singapore, arriving in London for official talks, is interviewed at the Airport:

Interviewer: "Welcome to London on this very cold night. You are going to have talks with the Secretary of State for the Colonies and others here in London on the constitutional future of Singapore. What are your own aims and hopes of these London talks?"

Marshall: "We all understand the same by independence, but these talks are merely primarily in fixing an agenda for the constitutional conference next Spring. To seek not independence, but complete internal self Government, as defined by all parties in Singapore, it means a fully elected legislature without any of the governor's nominees without any officials who are in control of the entire machinery of government with the exception of external defence and foreign affairs"....
