LAUNCHING OF "CARINTHIA".

Princess Margaret comes to John Brown's shipyard at Clydebank to launch the Carinthia, the third of four 22,000-ton Cunarders for the Canada run. Carinthia's sister ships Saxonia and Ivernia are already in service, and she will join them next June. Stabilisers are fitted to minimise rolling, and her steam turbines will give her some 20 knots.

Twenty thousand people, shipwrights and their families, cheer the Princess as she prepares to launch this creation of their skill.

And now the Princess closes the switch which sends the new ship gliding into the waters of the Clyde. In spite of the high wind, it is a perfect launching. The Carinthia's purpose, says the Princess, is to carry across the Atlantic people who are making new lives in Canada, and to bring to this country many thousands of Canadian visitors, binding us still more closely to that land of boundless opportunity.
