**QUEEN MOTHER ELIZABETH VISITS EXHIBITION IN Paris**  
**Pool coverage serviced to all competition**  
**Positive developed: 38 meters - 125 ft**

Queen Mother Elizabeth of Britain who is a native of Scotland arrived in Paris yesterday for a "semi-official" visit to open an exhibition of Franco-Scottish relations.

The Queen-Mother arrived aboard a special plane which was flying her personal standard.

One of her most important engagements after a private luncheon at the British Embassy with Ambassador Jebb and Lady Jebb, was an hour at the Franco-Scotland Exhibition in the Hotel de Rohan, with a welcoming address from Fine Arts Minister Jacques Bordenave.

After inspecting rare pictures and documents collected by the National Archives to illustrate seven centuries of Franco-Scottish friendship the Queen-Mother received the British colony in Paris at the Embassy.

Among various engagement in her short visit in Paris, Queen-Mother Elizabeth, had lunch yesterday with President of the Republic, Mr. Rene Coty at the Elysee Palace.

Arriving at 1.p.m. the Queen Mother was accompanied by Lady Jebb and Ambassador Jebb. She was greeted upon her arrival at the Elysee, by General Geneval, Mr. Jean Chauvel French Ambassador in London, Mr. de la Chauviniere Chief of Protocol and Colonel Audous Commandant of the Elysee Palace.

After a private luncheon with President Coty, the President of the Republic accompanied his guest to the Palace's threshold.

Later in the afternoon, Queen-Mother Elisabeth visited Versailles. After going through Queen Marie-Antoinettes' chambers she visited the Grand and Small Trianon. At the Trianon she was the guest of Representatives of the Commonwealth in Paris, and was greeted by Sirdar Malik Indian representative in Paris. Among hosts and guests were French Prefectoral authorities, the Conservator of Versailles and numerous France-British personalities.
