

MALENKOV ARRIVES:

A Russian aircraft brings Georgi Malenkov to London Airport, where Minister of Fuel and Power Aubrey Jones and Lord Citrine, Central Electricity Authority chairman, are there to greet him. Malenkov leads a delegation of Soviet electrical engineers who are touring British power stations and electrical installations as guests of the C.E.A., to see something of our achievements.

Strict security precautions are taken - for there are many emigre organisations in Britain who are opposed to the visit.

Thanking the Minister for his welcome, Malenkov says he is "happy to be here in your wonderful capital, the City of London".

The delegation leave the airport for the Soviet Embassy, where they are staying during their visit. Lord Citrine goes with them for an Embassy lunch, where he discovers that Malenkov is an admirer of Robert Burns. His favourite quotation? "A man's a man, for a' that"!
