

SCOTLAND v. ENGLAND

At Hampden Park, 134,000 people watch the last of the season's internationals - and as white-shirted England kick off against Scotland it's a thrilling moment indeed - for the winner will be champion, and the loser will be bottom of the international table. And a draw will mean a four-way tie.

England attacking on the left - but Tom Younger blocks it. A scramble to clear it - and Bobby Evans is away.

Jeff Hall tried to intercept - but it's Reg Matthews who makes a double save.

Less than a minute to go, and Scotland think it's all over but the shouting. Then without warning, Johnny Haynes slips through. Younger jumps, but it's in.

Scotland are thunderstruck - but it's true! By their last minute goal, England have made it the first four-way tie in international soccer history!
