Mingling with the thousands of ordinary Indians who press towards the sacred river are the Sadhus, the hely men, whose matted hair and seanty clething do not detract from their dignity - though even a hely man is allowed a smoke.

The Sadhus live in the kills and jumgles; only on special eccasions do they come to town - and this is indeed a special occasion. The twelve-yearly festival of Kunbh, the most suspicious of all; for every Hindu who bathes at the Steps of God during this festival has all the sins of the past washed away, and can start life afresh.
