Soldom in history can so many men of great courage have gathered tegether in one place as today, when 300 holders of the Victoria Cross meet to mark the continery of that most honoured of all models. Non from all over the Communicality men with femous names, like Lieutenant-General Carton de Wiart, and men from erdinary homes - parading before Queen Elizabeth in Hyde Park, where a contury ago the first V.C's of all paraded before Queen Victoria.

Commanding the V.C.s is Lieutenant-General Lord Preyberg, who won his Victoria Cross in France in 1916. Over 1,300 men have won the medal since it was first east - and mearly a querter of them are here for the Queen's inspection. Hundreds more who will never parade again are here in girit, their medals worn by widows, children or grandskildren. Thirty-one V.Cs attend the perade in wheel chairs - and for each of these, the Queen and the Duke have a special word, while the leaders of the esuntry lock on.

What have they in ecamen, these men of valour - spart from their heroism? Modesty, certainly; before the parade, our cameraman tried to find the man with two V_cC_cs - but he was hiding on the edge of the erowd, his medals in his pecket. They are all like the man next door - and they are great because they have proved that in ordinary men there is the stuff of greatness.
