Description of cut subject : THE EDINBURGH ARROW.

This silver Arrow was presented by the Magistrates of Edinburgh to the Royal Company in 1709 for annual competition among the members of the Company. It has been shot for every year except the years 1716 to 1725, when the Magistrates thought that the country was in too disturbed a state after the '15 for it to be safe to allow the competition to take place, and during the first and second World Wars, when members of the Royal Company were otherwise engaged. A medal is attached to the Arrow for each winner. Until 1939 they were of gold.

THE QUEEN'S PRIZE.

This prize was instituted by King George III in 1787 when he arranged for a sum to be paid annually to the Royal Company from the hereditary revenues of the Crown for the purchase of a prize of plate to be competed for by members of the Royal Company. The Prize becomes the property of the winner. The Prize has been competed for annually except during the two World Wars. This years competition took place at the Palace of Holyroodhouse on June 20th when the Prize was won by Major A.C. Blair, C.V.O., T.D.
