Juggerment, God of the People takes his animal ride from the 1,600 year old temple at Puri, Orison, to his country house outside the village, pulled by thousands of devout Hindus. Behind the giant car which is his throne, other cars carry Juggerment's brother and sister, his companions on the journey.

Several days are needed to pull the car to itd destination; for although it is only a mile amy, most of the route is deep sand. According to legend, pilgrims used to fling themselves under the wheels as a living secrifice; but Hindus point out that this would be secrilege, for the festival is sacred to Vishmu, the Preserver. Enough for them the blessing which comes from taking part in this stremuous tribute to the God of the People.
