RUSSIANS VISIT R. A. P.

To Homington R.A.F. Station, near Dury St. Edmands, comes the chief of Russia's air forces, Marshall Ehigarev. He is greeted by Air Marshall Sit Harry Broadhurst, C. - in C. Bomber Command, who takes him round the station. Marshal Ehigarev is visiting Britain with a group of senior efficers and civil aviation experts, and Hemington stages a special display for its Russian guests.
