

**MILITARY PARADE
AND DEMONSTRATION OF WORKING PEOPLE
ON RED SQUARE**

Moscow, the 7th of November 1956....

Troops of the Moscow Garrison are lined up on Red Square and the adjacent squares for the military parade.

On the reviewing stands are workers, collective farmers, deputies to the Supreme Soviet (Parliament), leaders of public organizations, outstanding scientists, personalities from the spheres of art and literature...

Among the guests are many foreign delegations which have arrived for the holiday celebrations.

On the reviewing stand of the Mausoleum are leaders of the Communist Party and the Soviet Government.

Marshal Moskalenko, who is in command of the parade, delivers his report to Marshal Zhukov.

Marshal Zhukov rides around the troops, greets them and congratulates them on the holiday of the Great October.

Then Marshal Zhukov, Soviet Minister of Defense, mounts the reviewing stand and delivers a speech.

Students of the various academies, sailors, soldiers, pupils of the Nakhimov and Suvorov schools participate in the military parade, on Red Square.

After the parade, a mass demonstration of the working people of the Soviet capital begins. Columns of athletes open the demonstration. They pass through Red Square...

The demonstration is a vivid testimony to the unity of the Soviet people, the Communist Party and the Soviet Government.
