LORD MAYOR'S APPEAL.

The Lord Mayor of London, Sir Cullum Welch, is hard at work sorting out the contributions to his Hungarian Relief Fund donations from the famous, and no-less welcome gifts from the ordinary people. At the time these scenes were filmed, the total was over £120,000, with more coming in by every post. Amounts reaching the Mansion House range from £25,000 subscribed by the members of Lloyds, to a child's shilling carefully wrapped in an envelope.

Five thousand pounds arrives from the Transport and General Workers' Union - while the National Farmers' Union decide to cancel their annual dinner and send the money to the Fund instead; typical of the desire of all sections of the community to help the victims of the Hungarian tragedy.

Four shillings from a six-year-old boy's money-box - and another two shillings from a mine-year-old help towards the target a million pounds!
