

ROYAL PORTRAITS.

Canadian-born artist Llewellyn Petley-Jones sketches his daughter Elizabeth while his wife and their other six children watch. Mr. Petley-Jones and his family live in Richmond, Surrey. He first came to London in 1934, but his birthplace was Edmonton, Alberta; so when the Government of Alberta wanted royal portraits for the State Parliament at Edmonton, what better choice than an Edmonton Artist who has made his name in Britain?

So Mr. Petley-Jones was commissioned to paint the portraits, and they are exhibited at London's Imperial Institute before being shipped to the Alberta Parliament, where they will hang on either side of the Speaker's Chair. Mr. H.A. McMillan, Agent-General for Alberta, and his wife examine the portraits with the artist.

Alberta's capital is fortunate in having an artist of its own whose talents are equal to this most honoured of all commissions.
