## THE MONT BLANC TRACEDL.

Twelve thousand feet above Chamonix rise the forbidding orags of Mont Blanc. Two young men are marconed near its towaring peak, and Chamonix is the headquarters of a hazardous rescue operation. The famous akating rink has become a helicopter base. Altogether there are ten men on the mountain in peril of their lives - the two stranded alimbers, four airmen who grash-landed a helicopter in a first rescue attempt, and four paraclasticts who joined the search.

The two climbers, near to death with freshbite, are sheltering in the crashed helicopter. But an 80-mile-an-hour gale prevents any further landings. The eight men who reached the spot have managed to struggle to a mearby refuge but. When all hope of saving the two lives has gone, the would-be resources are themselves resound. Their tragedy is that they reached the dying men while they were still alive, but that it was not humanly penalble, to bring them to mafety. Two of them were injured in the attempt; and whatever could be done, they have done.
