WHERE MY CARAVAN HAS RESTED:

Forty families on a caravan site in Rainham, Essex - 180 people, including 30 children and six expectant mothers. Their landlord has been fined for refusing to evict them - and has gone to gaol twice rather than pay. But now the High Court says they must go. Here is Mrs. Kemp, who has lived in this caravan for four years, and pays £3. 10. a week for it. Others, like Mrs. Frier, own their caravans, and pay a pound a week for the site.

The High Court judgement is a tragic blow for the caravanners - for they have, quite simply, nowhere else to go. Many of them, like Mr. Davison, are ex-servicemen, and feel strongly that they deserve a better deal. But another side of the question is put by neighbouring householders.
