PRINCE CHARLES' NEW SCHOOL

Pathé News visits the school where the heir to the throne will spend the next few years of his life - Cheam School, near Newbury, in Berkshire. Prince Charles' father was a Cheam pupil from 1930 to 33, and the school has had royal patronage since the First World War. The school has a country house setting, its gardens and playing fields occupying 55 acres.

But even with 55 acres, one feature is traditional - the brick wall wicket. A first visitor takes advantage of holiday time - for during the terms it's a boys-only school. On Sundays, the pupils go to the Parish church, where the services are conducted by the Reverend Reginald Rabbetts. Times have changed so fast it is difficult to realise that Prince Charles will one day be the first British Sovereign to be able to say "I went to School".
