LAST OF THE WINDJAMERS:

The Pamir, one of the last of the great windjessers is no more. For more than half a century, this gracious lady has been sailing the world's oceans - not as a more museum-piece for tourists' comeras, but as a working vessel, corning her living first as a merchant man, then as a training ship for German codets.

All the world loved the Pamir; she recalled the days when seafaring held more becuty than today, and perhaps more excitement. All the world was horrified at the news of her loss in an Atlantic hurricane. Pifty-two of these lads, plus a crew of 35, were abourd her when she sailed from Hemburg on the last trip of her long life. Righty-seven hands - and most of them will not come back.

And while rejeicing that some at least of her company have survived, all the world mourns a great ship and the men and boys who went down with her.
