FREE CHINA MARKS OWN "JULY 4TH"!

Report from a fortress of democracy - Formosa, or as the Chinese call it - Taiwan. With President Chiang Kai-shek you are looking at the face of a Free China, demonstrating its military preparedness as it stands with its eyes ever toward the Red-held mainland. Representatives from around the world view latest American equipment in this spectacle marking the 46th anniversary of the revolt which sparked the first Chinese Republic. A "4th of July" type of holiday banned by Communist rulers on the mainland.

Now a remarkable panorama of troop strength - drawing the admiration of Madame Chiang and the multitudes - as 10,000 soldiers double-time to hear their leader.

Trained under US military guidance, they're part of a 600,000 man army. They hear words from President Chiang echoed by Taiwan's 10 million Chinese: "We are a dedicated people. We will return to our homes on the mainland."
