REMARKABLE FILMS OF
MISSILE FIRINGS!

Mobilization of allied scientific skills is on the agenda as British Prime Minister MacMillan flies to Washington to be met by Secretary of State Dulles. In the face of Russia's growing power and its challenge to the world in the missiles race, the heads of state of two foremost nations will realistically appraise the fields of weapons research and technology. At the White House President Eisenhower, the Prime Minister and Mr. Dulles are joined for the momentous talks by British Foreign Secretary Selwyn Lloyd.

Meanwhile, the US marshalls its propoganda weapons - to counter Red claims with announcements of democracy's strides in the realm of space rockets.

At Cape Canaveral, Florida, some 200 miles north of Miami, the excitement becomes electric. A boom town in the setting of the Air Force Missile Test Center is mecca for the press of the nation. As never before, information on missile firings goes out to the public so that the world may know that Uncle Sam is sky-rocketing the "Jupiter", the "Thor", the "Polaris" - names given to intermediate range ballistic missiles designed to travel 1500 miles.

As night falls, the News of the Day camera is ready to photograph - from 12 miles - a spectacular and successful test of the Jupiter rocket.

Searchlights shine brightly on the Jupiter, causing a glow to appear around it. To the South, Miami residents report seeing it pass overhead. A nother firing to emphasize the stopped-up US program to find a missile capable of taking a satellite into outer space, following Russia's success with the first earth satellite.

To this end the Navy's long-heralded Vanguard is about to flight-test its first stage, 27,000 pound thrust engine. You're looking at remarkable slow motion films as for the first time the Dept. of Defense permits us to share a seat close-up to one of these massive bullets leaving its launching pad.

This is the rocket which will help launch a moon for the US. It will zoom the satellite on its initial miles into space. Second and third stage engines, which are dummies in this test, will take over to put the satellite in its orbit.

The Pentagon labels the test successful as eyes and minds of our times remain fixed on outer space.

MAN-MADE EARTH SATELLITE

The first man-made satellite of our earth was launched in the Soviet Union on October the 4th, 1957. By the end of October the 11th it has circled the globe more than 100 times. Observations of the satellite are carried on day and night. This is one of the radio stations near Moscow. The first reconnoiterer of the cosmic space is to appear over Moscow at 6.50 a.m., local time. Correspondents of the "Radio Latest News" are all ready to broadcast the signals of the automatic radio transmitter installed on the satellite. It is now approaching... and flies over the Soviet capital exactly at the calculated time. Every home is listening to its signals...and it's only natural that the Soviet people feel proud of their scientists responsible for this discovery. Nikolai Honenko and Adolf Malin, radio fans, were among the first to receive the signal from the satellite. Radio amateur Haliksoo in Tallin, capital of Soviet Estonia, is receiving the satellite's signals regularly. All these observations are of great importance for the scientists. Naval seamen are also receiving its signals from the cosmos. 66 stations of optical observation are following the movement of the satellite the clock round. The Soviet people display tremendous interest in the great discovery of Soviet science. Moving at a speed of about 29.000 kilometres per hour, the satellite completes a full revolution around the earth in 95 minutes. The whole world considers this event as the beginning of a new era in history of human culture. In foreign newspapers one can see nowadays various schemes and drawings explaining the construction of the artificial satellite and the course it follows around the planet. Such drawings are to be found in many newspapers. American papers write: "The Soviet Union has won the contest for penetrating into interplanetary space". The creation of the artificial earth satellite opens a new era in the the cognition of the universe. This is what Avenir Yakovkin, the director of the Ukrainian Academy of Sciences' Observatory, said: "This amazing discovery brings us right up to the point of solving those fantastic problems which are at the limits of our possibilities".

"We are convinced that our further successes will lead to the creation of an interplanetary base and will finally give man the opportunity of conquering the celestial space". The outstanding aircraft designer, Andrei Tupolev, had this to say: "A great event took place. For the first time man was able to create a satellite of our earth...and it was done by our Soviet scientists, by our Soviet men, it was done by the Soviet people".

THE EARTH SATELLITE CONTINUES ITS FLIGHT

Leningrad...The Soviet people continue to show great interest in everything that has something to do with the flight of the man-made satellite of our Earth--the greatest discovery of our times. At the Pulkovo Observatory scientists have been studying the distant worlds of the Universe for many decades. And now the Observatory staff is closely watching the new heavenly body-- the artificial earth satellite. This is the Leningrad Pioneer Palace. These children are sure to be witness of interplanetary journeys. The satellite is being observed everywhere...on the banks of the Neva... and on the banks of the Amur in the Far East. While this is a very early hour, but the Khabarovsk radio fan, Alexander Gorkovenko, is already up...and so are his daughters. The satellite signals, heard often at their home, have already become habitual with the family. There are a good many radio fans down the Amur too, in the town of Komsomolsk. And they, too, often hear the signals from the satellite. In Novosibirsk observations are carried on the clock round. The flight of the artificial earth satellite remains to be in the highlights throughout the world. This is what Soviet Academician Anatoly Blagonravov has to say: 'A delegation of the USSR Academy of Sciences has recently been at Washington, capital of the U.S.A., attending the International Geophysical Year Rocket and Satellite Conference which was called in order to coordinate all research work during the International Geophysical Year. The news of the launching of the Soviet earth satellite was received when the conference was still continuing its work. the news made a stunning impression in the U.S.A.,

indeed. Not only the scientists but the common people as well have highly responded to this event. There were voices who claimed that we have undermined the American prestige in the scientific and political spheres. ~~There~~ There seemed to be two camps among the American scientists. Some, as true scientists, were sincerely rejoicing the success attained by science in general, while others had a feeling of bitterness for it was the Soviet scientists that first **have** ~~now~~ succeeded in solving the big technical problem. However, it's especially gratifying that this fine present was made on the eve of the Great Anniversary -- the 40th anniversary of the Great October Revolution. This is not only a present, but a vivid illustration of the enormous way of development that Soviet science has covered for the 40 years of Soviet power".

INTERVIEW WITH MR. MORGAN PHILIPS

S.V. BILL SIMONS AND MR. MORGAN PHILIPS.

BILL SIMONS ASKS QUESTION "SIR IN SHORT WHAT WAS THE LABOUR PARTY'S REPLY TO THIS LETTER." 7

MR. MORGAN PHILIPS REPLIES "WELL IF I SHORTEN THE ANSWER IT IS CONFINED TO THREE POINTS. THE FIRST IS THAT WE POINTED OUT THAT OUR PARTY IN OPPOSITION AS THE LABOUR PARTY IS AT PRESENT COULD NOT ENTER INTO OFFICIAL NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE GOVERNMENT, AND THIS LETTER OF COURSE CAME TO US VIA THE SOVIET EMBASSY AND WE COULDN'T THINK OF IT ~~OTHERWISE~~ OTHERWISE THAN HAVING COME FROM THE SOVIET GOVERNMENT. THE SECOND POINT IS THAT WE REJECTED ANY QUESTION OF TALKS BETWEEN THE LABOUR PARTY AND THE RUSSIAN COMMUNIST PARTY BECAUSE OF ~~REASONS~~ REASONS THAT ARE PRETTY WELL KNOWN IN BRITAIN WE CANNOT ENTER INTO JOINT ACTIVITIES WITH COMMUNIST PARTIES. THE THIRD POINT IS THAT WE SAY THAT THE MATTER IS NOW BEFORE THE UNITED NATIONS AND IT SHOULD BE LEFT THERE AND THAT WE FINISH BY GIVING AN ASSURANCE THAT THE LABOUR PARTY WOULD DO EVERYTHING IT POSSIBLY COULD TO PRESERVE ~~THE~~ AN INTERNATIONAL PEACE." 99

I THINK IF THE AMERICAN GOVERNMENT AND THE ~~GOVERNMENT~~ BRITISH GOVERNMENT WERE TO GET TOGETHER, MAKE UP THEIR MINDS THAT WE WOULD NEGOTIATE FOR OIL ON A COMMERCIAL BASIS ~~IT~~ AND GIVE ECONOMICAL AID TO THE AREA TO REMOVE POVERTY AND INJUSTICE AND DEAL WITH THE REFUGEE FUND I THINK WE COULD SOLVE PEACE, THE PROBLEM OF PEACE FOR THE NEXT TEN OR TWENTY YEARS."
