

QUEEN'S COUSIN WEDS:

This young couple have no titles - but they've just had a Royal Wedding at St. George's Chapel, Windsor; for the bride Miss Anne Abel Smith, is a second cousin of the Queen. Her Brussels lace veil was given to Queen Mary by Queen Victoria. The groom is Mr. David Liddell-Grainger, Scottish farmer and one-time Guards officer. Among the 11 bridesmaids are three princesses - Christina of Sweden, and Beatrix and Irene of the Netherlands.

The Queen chats with Colonel Sir Henry Abel Smith, the bride's father. The Duchess of Kent, Princess Alexandra, and Prince Michael are here, Queen Juliana of the Netherlands and the Queen Mother. Also among the Royal guests are Princess Sibylla of Sweden, Princess Andrew of Greece, and Princess Alice, Countess of Athlone, grandmother of the bride.

The guests make their way from St. George's Chapel towards the Waterloo Chamber in the Castle itself, for the reception. Altogether, it's the biggest wedding Windsor has seen in the past ten years.
