

RECORD BOBSLEIGH RUN.

Near the beautiful little town of Garmisch-Partenkirchen, nestling below the peaks of the Bavarian Alps, lies the Olympic bob-sleigh course, where the world championship for two-man bob-sleighs is being decided. Here's the American couple Dick and Severino.

But before they reach the finish news comes back that they've overturned. The British team of Parkinson and Williams also fail to complete the course - though encouraged by their supporters they start handsomely. But as usual, it's the Continentals, born to the sport, who make the best time. Here's an Austrian couple, Aste and Isser, making sure of third place - and from Italy, Zardini and Scierpaes, who come second.

But it's another Italian pair, reigning world champions Monti and Alvera, who beat the lot - and not content with merely defending their title, they've managed to knock three-tenths of a second off the course record set up in 1953.
