Two-Bob-Sleigh World Championships 1958

More than 10.000 enthusiasts witnessed a record run in the last heat of the championships. The world two-bob-sleigh champions Eugenio Monti/Enzo Alvera (Italy) defended their title successfully when they chased through the 16 bends of the Olympic track at a new record time: 1 : 14,28. (29/100 secs under Ostler's record of 1953).

The hotel-owner and his expert brakeman from Cortina beat their countrymen Zardini/Sciorpaes who made 1 : 15,56.

The Austrians Aste/Isser were third.

The Garmisch team Roesch/Hammer were fifth after bad luck on a damaged track in the Bavaria Bend.

The Swiss Zoller/Leu were a few hundredths of seconds better and were fourth.

The US bob I of Dick/Severino spilled and the British bob with Parkinson/Williams capsized near the finish.
