**SURINAM RECEIVES H.R.H. PRINCESS BEATRIX/**

With a surprising enthusiasm H.R.H. Princess Beatrix was welcomed by the Surinam people on her arrival in the capital Paramaribo.

Accompanied by the Minister of Social Affairs, Princess Beatrix visited some institutions of youth-health, including the Home for children of mothers-without a job.

The little ones were fully conscious of this Royal visit.

From Paramaribo Princess Beatrix travelled to the eastern part of the country where in Moenge she visited the installations of the Surinam Bauxiet Company. Nearby in the native forest is sheltered the little village of Moengetapee. Here the Princess herself filmed the decorated native boats.

All inhabitants of the village accompanied H.R.H. on her walk to the dance-plain, where a dance-demonstration was given.

Again Princess Beatrix handled the camera.

Another tremendous welcome was performed at Albina near the Marowijne-river, which forms the border between Netherlands Surinam and French Guiana.

Present here were also some Wajama-Indians, who had to travel 2 days to be able to greet the Princess from that far and unknown Holland.

Lots of presents the people here had brought with them and the presentation of head-chains and self woven clothes became a natural free and easy ceremony without the usual tight protocol.

A very uncommon experience for Princess Beatrix during her successful tour through Surinam.
