QUEEN MOTHER AT GUILLEHALL:

At the Quildhall, the City of London welcomes the Queen Mother home after her Commonwealth tour - a tour which has made her the first member of Britain's reyal family to fly round the world. Thirty-five thousand miles by air - to Comada, Fiji, New Zealand, Australia, across the Indian Ocean, and finally to Africa. Princess Margaret is on the platform with her mether as the Lord Mayer, Sir Demis Truscott, gives London's greeting. In her reply, the Queen Mother refers to the engine trouble which marred the last stages of her programme:

"I have myself some experience of the disappointment of seeing danaling success snatched from one, even after the last fence! (Laughter) And my sympathy is much with the gallent crews who werked so unceasingly to complete their task. It is hardly possible without a personal contact to realise the intensity with which membership of the British Commonwealth is cherised by those who I am so lately seeing. It is my belief that and my prayer that the unity and the strength of the Commonwealth may yet provide the foundation upon which may be built that for which we all pray today, peace throughout the world".
