Visit of HRH The Princess Margaret to British
Army Units in Germany

Sunny spring weather prevailed in Hamburg, when the sister of the British Queen, HRH Princess Margaret Rose, arrived at the airport with a special RAF plane. A wave of sympathy welcomed the British princess. Thousands of Hamburgians had come to the airport and lined the streets through which the royal convoy passed en route to Lüneburg, where The Highland Light Infantry, 1st Battalion, is stationed. HRH is Colonel-in-Chief of the regiment.

The Princess was met at the airport by representatives of the German Federal President and the Senate of the Free and Hanseatic City of Hamburg. Present at the reception were: Sir Christopher Steel, the UK-Ambassador at Bonn, Major General Branwell Davis, Honorary Colonel of the Highlanders, Sir Dudley Ward, Commander of the BAOR, Cecil King, Consul General in Hamburg and other high officers.

The princess was then conducted through Hamburg to Lüneburg.

The ^{Princess} arrived at the dais and received the Royal Salute.

Inspection of the parade - Trooping the Colour - marching past in slow and quick time.

The Highland Regiment in the traditional kilts presented a colourful spectacle. The Pipers played "Blue Bonnets" and other popular bagpipe tunes.

After inspection of a second British regiment HRH will return home.
