German Grand Prix at the Nurburgring

The "Ring" is a road circuit of 14 1/2 miles to the lap, winding up and down the mountainous Eifel near the Belgian frontier. There are some 178 corners per lap and the circuit embodies all the hazards of a normal road. As Tony Brooks said, the "Ring" is one big question mark, always challenging the driver with this infinite variety-verges, hedges, banks, varying gradients and overhanging tress. The present lap-record: 178 corners in 9 1/2 minutes!

More than 100.000 racing fans axi had come to the Nurburgring to watch the XX. German Grand Prix over 342,15 kms and 15 laps.

43 cars (Formula I and II) were at the start!

In the first row: Mike Hawthorn (No. 3 on Ferrari) - Peter Collins (No. 2 on Ferrari) - Tony Brooks (No. 8 on Vanwall) - Stirling Moss (No. 7 on Vanwall).

Moss leads in the <u>first laps</u> and breaks the lap-record of Juan Manuel Fangio already in the third round. Averaging 149,9 kms/hour he sets a new record at 9.08.2 minutes! However, Moss had enginetrouble in the 4th lap and has to quit. Hawthorn takes over the lead.

In the second lap:

Moss - Hawthorn - Collins - Brooks - Schnell.

In the ninth lap:

Collins leads - Brooks overtakes Hawthorn.

Elementh lap:

Brooks leads 100 m. in front of Hawthorn - Then the news breaks: Collins has crashed! (He is taken by helicopter to hospital where he dies.)

12th lap:

Brooks still leads - but the red Ferrari of Hawthorn is out of the race.
