NARRATION

Thirty-five thousand people jam Laurel Race Course in Maryland to witness the seventh running of the \$100,00 Washington, D. C. International. With nine horses, representing seven countries, ready to go. the favorite is Ireland's Ballymoss. Two horses, Zaryad and Garnier, running in myther one and number two positions, were brought from the Soviet Union. They are the first horses from Russia to participate in the classic. They're off with Tudor Era of the United States taking the lead. Rounding the turn, Australia's Sailor's Guide nearly overtakes the American horse, Tudor Era. (SOF UP FOR 30 SECS. OF CROWD NOISE) Perfect fall weather gives the horses a fast track for the mile and a half run for \$70,000 winner's

money. The two Russian entries are running back of the leaders. .: (SOF UP FOR CROWD NOISE TO CROWD SHOT) Going around the far turn, Tudor Era holds its lead widening the distance by a comfortable three and a half lengths, (HOLD TO STRETCH RUN) Going into the finish; Tudor Era moves to the line fast followed by Sailor's Guide and Ballymoss with Tharp of Ireland trailing. As they cross the line, it's. Tudor Era, with Sailor's Guide second and Ballymoss third in a photo finish for place. (HOLD TO FINISH) Then jockey Howard Grant riding Sailor's Guide claims his horse was fouled going around the far turn into the stretch. Tudor Era's trip to the winning circle is to no avail and the judges call the Australian Sailor's Guide to take home the big prize money. Maryland's Governor McKelden congratulates the owners of Sailor's Guide, A. C. and Keith Dibb.
