NEW LIFEBOAT CAN'T SINK.

It's quite safe to rock the boat this time, because it's practically impossible to sink it. The plastic lifeboat took Gustav Kuhr seven years to design and make. Exit is easy, one side or the other, however much she may list. Once down the hatch, the crew and passengers can defy almost any weather. In fact, short of a collision it's difficult to see what could make the boat sink. Closed up, it's like being in a submarine for the forty people who can be accommodated. The little boat could be sucked down sixty feet by a sinking ship, and still bob up smiling, the engine going, and all set for return to harbour. Plexiglass globes, fore and aft, give a clear view, even when the four hatches are sealed.
