



BRITISH SHEEPDOGS FOR RUSSIA

Pedigroe Livestock from Local Breeders to go by Channel Airlift.

Livestock bought from local British breeders by a Russian trade delegation will be flown across the Channel, on the first part of its journoy to Russia, on Tuesday noxt, 25th Novembor.

From Southend Airport, 139 animals will be airlifted by Bristol freighter aircraft of the CHANNEL AIR BRIDGE to Rotterdam. Mr. Howard Surch a Reading farmer, travels with the stock, which will then go by train to the Czechoslovak frontier. It is the first time British pedigree livestock exported to Russia, have been flown across the Channel. In all, nineteen pedigree bulls, 100 pedigree rams and 20 working sheepdogs are leaving in this shipment. This is the result of a contract signed between the Russian trade organisation, "Prodintorg", responsible for the import and export of foodstuffs, and British Livestock Limited of London.


The bulls and rams are to be used to improve Russian strains of cattle and sheep. The sheepdogs (18 Border and two English collies) are to start a line of working sheepdogs in Russia. At present, Russian shepherds control their flocks without dogs.

Local brooders whose stock is in this shipment are:-

NOTE: Facilities for Press and cameramen will be available at Southend Airport on Tuesday next, November 25th. Loading of livestock will be in two stages. First loading into three aircraft, takes place between 8. and 9.30 pm. These aeroplanes return for the second shipment and reload between 12.30 and 2 p.m. appreximately.

BRITISH SHEEPDOGS FOR RUSSIA

Channel airlift of pedigree livestock for the Soviets

British pedigree livestock sold to Russia will, for the first time, be flown across the Channel.

On Tuesday next 25th November, 139 picked animals will be flown from Southend Airport to Rotterdam by Bristol freighter aircraft of the CHANNEL AIR BRIDGE. This shipment is the result of a contract signed between the Russian trade organisation for the import and export of foodstuffs, "Profintorf,", and British Livestock Limited of London.

Mr Howard Surch, a Reading farmer, is travelling with the stock as far as the Czecho-Slovak frontier. From Rotterdam the spimals will go by rail.

Trained sheepdogs are being sent to Russia for the first time. At present Soviet shepherds control their flocks without dogs. With 18 Border and 2 English Collies they hope to produce a line of working sheepdogs.

The British stock, to be used for the improvement of Russian strains, consists of 19 pedigree bulls and 100 pedigree rams. The 20 sheepdogs will be in the same shipment.

The bulls are 12 Hereford, five Aberdeen Angus and two Shorthorn. The rams are 25 Oxford Down, 33 Romney Marsh, 25 Suffolk and 17 Shropshire.



BRITISH SHEEPDOGS FOR RUSSIA

Channel Airlift of Pedigree Livestock

British pedigree livestock - bulls and rams, with twenty trained sheepdogs bound for Russia, will be flown across the Channel for the first time next week.

On Tuesday November 25th, 139 picked animals - 19 pedigree bulls, 100 rams and 20 sheepdogs, will be flown from Southend Airport to Rotterdam in Bristol freighter aircraft of the CHANNEL AIR BRIDGE. From Rotterdam they will travel by rail to Russia via Czechoslovakia. Travelling with the animals as far as the Czechoslovak frontier, is Mr. Howard Surch, a Reading farmer.

For the first time Soviet shepherds are to use sheepdogs, and the Soviet trade organisation "Prodintorg" have purchased, through British Livestock Limited of London, 18 Border and two English collies, which will start a line of working sheepdogs in Russia.

NOTE: Facilities for Press and cameramen will be available at Southend Airport on Tuesday next, November 25th.

Loading of livestock will be in two stages. First loading, into three aircraft, takes place between 8 and 9.30 a.m. These aeroplanes return for the second shipment and reload between 12.30 and 2 p.m. approximately.
