

MEMORIAL TO AMERICANS.

The Lord Mayor bore the Pearl Sword of the City of London, in London's Cathedral of St. Paul's. Britain and America joined together, in persons of high and lowly estate, and in the spirit of millions, present in thought. The Queen and Vice President Nixon led two nations allied by unquenchable faith in undying freedom. On this morning, grey with November fog outside, brilliant in St. Paul's, was dedicated and consecrated the American Memorial Chapel. Enshrined in this holy place, in a book of remembrance, are the names of the twenty-eight thousand Americans of the armed forces who died in Britain, or while based in Britain.

The Chairman of the Executive of the Chapel Fund, Lord Baillieu, invited the Queen to unveil the inscription.

In the minds of the Royal Family, the Vice President, and the three thousand people of the great congregation, was the memory of the men who came across the Atlantic, but did not return. They died that freedom should not perish from the earth. We shall remember them....
