WINSTON HAS ONE-MAN SHOW.

Basking in the south of France, Sir Winston Churchill escapes the chilly onset of spring at home, sometimes beguiling the sunny hours painting. Meanwhile, an Exhibition of his pictures is held at the Royal Academy, and among distinguished persons at the private view were Lady Churchill and her daughter, Mrs. Sandys. Bottlescape (most eloquent title) was painted in 1932, when Sir Winston had been an amateur artist for 13 years. His friends Lord Montgomery and Sir Alan Herbert admired the picture of Blenheim Tapestries. Winston Churchill is proud of being an Honorary Academician Extraordinary, the title by which the art world acknowledges his ability as a painter. President of the Royal Academy, Sir Charles Wheeler, like other sound judges, has remarked how the vigour of Sir Winston's personality is reflected in his painting. An Academy one-man-show by an amateur is surely unique. May Sir Winston live to paint many more fine pictures.
