The machine chosen is a D.K.R. 325 c.c. made by Villiers Manufacturing Company of Wolverhampton.

The caravan is a recent invention of the Sheet Metal Company of Southbourne, near Portsmouth. Weighing only 3 hundredweight it is made of fibre glass and states

5 feet 11 inches high and is 6 feet 6 inches by 5 feet in area. When not in use it
can be folded down to 3 feet high.
