STARS TO PRESENT TROPHIES AT VARIETY CLUB SANDOWN PARK MEETING

~~Jayne Mansfield and Frederick Crawford~~ are along the many show-business stars who are attending the Variety Club of Great Britain's Sandown Park race meeting on Saturday (September 12th).

Miss Mansfield will present the gold vase to the winning owner of the Lyons Maid Stakes, the main race of the day, and Crawford will present the trophy for the Pepsi-Cola Selling Stakes.

Other stars who will be at the meeting include Jack Hawkins, Janette Scott, Aldo Ray, Douglas Fairbanks, Wilfrid Hyde White, Max Eygraves, Ronald Shiner, Stanley Baker, George Baker, Bernard Bresslaw, Ann Todd, Bud Flanagan, Heather Sears, Peter Sellers, Len Lyon, Vera Lynn, David Tomlinson, Peggy Cullins, Anthony Newley, Anne Aubrey, Bernie Winters, James Booth, Jackie Rae, Carole Lesley, Vanda Hudson, Mary Peach, Arthur Fling and John Slater.

Ted Heath and his band will play before racing.

The Sandown Park authorities have been watering the course and excellent racing conditions are assured.

All six races in the programme have been sponsored and £17,000 in prize money will be at stake. Additional to the Lyons Maid Stakes (for £5,000) and Pepsi Cola Selling Stakes (£2,000), the programme features the Association of Rails Looklakers Handicap (£2,000), the Billy Lutlin Handicap (£2,000), the Solaris Two-Years-Old Stakes (sponsored by the Tote Investors and Sandown Park) (£4,000), and the Daily Mirror Nursery Handicap (£2,000).

The first race is at 2.15; the last at 5.10.

♥ THE HEART OF SHOW BUSINESS



Six trophies, valued at over £1,000, have been donated for the occasion by Messrs Mappin and Webb, and every winning owner will receive a cup for permanent possession.

The cost of printing the race card for the day is being defrayed by Miss Enid Chanelle, director of the noted fashion houses of that name, and this will boost Variety Club's 'take' by £1,500.

Proceeds from the Meeting, the first of its kind in Britain for 45 years, are to be allocated to the children's charities supported by Variety Club, who anticipate a sum in the region of £15,000 - £20,000 from the day.

The racing committee is headed by Mr. Irving Allen, with Mr. Nat Cohen as his deputy. Both are leading Variety Club members and their committee includes Mr. Bill Butlin, Variety Club's reigning Chief Barker (president), sponsor of one of the races.

The Meeting is to be an annual event and plans are already in hand for the presentation, next year at Sandown Park, of the biggest international event ever to be held in this country.

Variety Club has donated over £360,000 to youth charities in Britain and for the past 2½ years has given away an average of £1,000 a week. The club was formed in 1949 and now has 660 members, all of whom are associated with the show-business professions. H.R.H. Prince Philip and Earl Mountbatten and Life Members.
