The VC Ten will carry a maximum of 150 passengers, at about 600 miles an hour; the power provided by four Rells Royce Commay engines. It will be in the air by 1961. The engineers concerned believe that engines mounted in the rear are best. But the VC Ten isn't the only aircraft built at Weybridge. There's the Vanguard too; (Turbo-prep, twice as big as the famous Viscount). It will fly on ERA routes next summer.
