Establishing shots of TABLE MOUNTAIN - CAPE TOWN.
Scene of Adderley Street, ~~street of the~~

Road block at the entrance of one of the main native locations (LANGA) showing returning workers boarding municipal bus, and given ARMY PROTECTION AGAINST intimidators.

Scenes of troop and army personnel and equipment ready for action if called upon.

Reel 2

PAINTED in large black letters on a bridge used by motorists were the words "Release arrested leaders."

Docu workers back at work and the export of S. African goods resumed.

Scenes of PARLIAMENT buildings where parliament is at present in session discussing various aspects of the Emergency bills passed during the present session.

CAPE TOWN CASTLE with its 5 bastions, was established by the Prince of Orange in 1666, today

South Africa's oldest building, takes on a new lease of life as Army + Navy personnel move in and take over for the duration of The Emergency.

Reel 3 Further road block scenes established to divert traffic from location areas in case of trouble. Aircraft patrol by day. Apartheid in practise. (General shots of apartheid - Cape Town)

Reel 4 Parliamentary leaders

- ① 1) Sir de Villiers Graaf - Leader of the Opposition - (with Car + motorcycle)
- ② 2) Mr. Erasmus - Minister of Defence (~~Minister~~) & in charge of emergency operations
- ③ 3) Mr. de Wet Nel - B. Minister of Bantu Administration

Other house of Assembly ministers attending the session

Reel 5 Police interrogation of alleged intimidators Coloured + native children at play in their respective areas. Coloured families in their own area

Reel 6 Castle - now taken over by military for emergency use.

Army vehicles in use carrying men & material. Troops called up for service arriving at destination.
(Call up notices have been served on reserve forces throughout the Union)
Street scenes - in towns showing return to normality after initial troubles, etc.

leel 7: Mr Eric Louw (Louw) arrives at Parliament for debate on emergency (MINISTER of ~~External~~ External Affairs)
Further groups of cabinet ministers arriving for session.

At police 70 arrival of MR. BEN SHOEMAN (SHOEMAN) Minister of Transport - walks across road & raises hat to camera.

leels 8, 9 & 10. NYANGA & LANGA TOWNSHIPS:

Scene where intensive police action over the last 10 days has now restored things to normal. Scenes of huts & homes with women & children burnt out & looted cars damaged in last

Weeks riots.

Saracen tank at Police Station in location where it is being retained for emergency use. Fire scarred buildings showing riot damage effected to location buildings - PASS office where all native records were destroyed - scenes of burnt out filing drawers, typewriters, furniture etc. Also burnt out church & library building - fire scarred remains of buildings

Reel 10. Cemetery at Langa where Police action killed 3 natives a short time ago. Cemetery scenes and graves. Spotter aircraft overhead maintaining check on township day & night.

Reel 11 - Assaulted by a surly Policeman!
Camera thrown to ground - writer treated in hospital 2 stitches
