NO VIOLENCE DEMONSTRATION Positive developed 35 mm: 18 meters - 60 feet

On Saturday afternoon about 500 adopts of non-vielence staged a sit6dean demonstration in Vincennes, North-East suburb of Paris.

Hear the old Vincennes Castle, and headed by famous writer and non-violence philosophy, Lansa del Vasto, a disciple of Hahatma Gandhi in India, and other personnalities, they sat down, silently, helding placerds with slogans such as "Peace in Algeria" and "No to Comps".

Police forces swiftly arrived on the scene, and when demonstrators refused to move, carried them away to waiting buses. Demonstrators did not resist, and policeums used no violence, but they were nevertheless foreibly removed from the street; a number of the non-violence demonstrators were taken to the graveside of a policeum who was killed last week in a terrorist attempt in a Paris street, to show them why force had to be used against force and treacherous attacks from terrorylats in the metropolis.

The demonstration ended quietly and no arrests were made,
