A new personality is to lead a national campaign for better driver education, the Royal Automobile Club announced today. His name is "R.A.C. Reg", the symbol of The Association of R.A.C. Registered Motor Schools and Driving Instructors.

From today, all cars belonging to members of the Association will be readily identifiable because Reg's picture will be carried on them. He will also be seen on office and showroom windows belonging to R.A.C. Registered Instructors.

The public will know that wherever R.A.C. Reg is to be seen, first-class driving instruction from properly qualified teachers will be available.

Instructors submitting themselves for examination by the R.A.C. face a very stiff written and practical test. Those who pass (and about half fail at the first attempt) can justly claim to be competent teachers.

The scheme was started in 1935 in pursuance of the Club's belief that better tuition was the first step towards greater road safety. There are now over 2,300 R.A.C. Registered Instructors and 173 Registered Motor Schools throughout the country.
