THE QUEEN OPENS TAY BRIDGE.

After a Scottish heliday Her Majesty resumed her busy round by opening the bridge over the River Tay at Perth. It replaces the one built 60 years ago, the Victoria Bridge. That was constructed in the dawn of the motor age and proved unequal to modern traffic. It was demoliahed and this up-to-the-minute pre-strenged concrete bridge takes its place.

The Queen then unveiled the memorial plaque, watched by the Lord Provest and 7,000 people. The bridge cost about £160,000.

The Head Bay of Porth Academy, Alastair Gruickshank, presented a broach of Tay pearls, a gift of the city. Then from the head girl, Linda Buchan, the Duke received a pen-stand, in the shape of the new bridge.
