Cruising Grounds 1500 miles

Many hundreds of additional moorings have also been provided along the waterways and this year, for the first time, British Waterways are to provide a new type of mooring giving temporary overnight accommodation away from the established mooring areas. These new moorings, which are now being prepared and sited for the coming season, have been planned to save pleasure boaters from having to undertake unnecessary cruising to reach permanent moorings by nightfall. Details of their locations will be made available to all pleasure boaters.
