YACHT DASING AND MODRINGS

Three new and well-equipped yealt basing have been constructed at St. Pancras (in the heart of London), Stourport-on-Savern, and Worcester, to provide safe anchorage throughout the year for hundreds of pleasure craft including sea and river-going classes as well as canal boats. Some of these new basins have dry-docks or alipways where the construction of the season and maintenance.

Many hundreds of additional moorings have also been provided along the waterways and this year, for the first time, British Waterways are to provide a new type of mooring giving temporary overnight accommodation away from the established mooring areas. These new moorings, which are now being propered and signposted in time for the coming season, have been planned to save pleasure beaters from having to undertake unnecessary cruising to reach permanent moorings by nightfall. Details of their locations will be made available to all pleasure beaters.
