HARBOUR FOR KARIBA.

Impounded by the Kariba Dam the vast man-made lake is rapidly growing towards its projected size, while the Victoria Falls, higher up the Zambesi, are almost at the peak volume of the year.

Kariba Lake is some way yet from its full extent of 2,000 square miles. That's why, at Singazongwe, they're constructing a harbour miles from any water. There will be water here in about three years time; and as the Lake will play a big part in Rhodesian industrial life, not to mention tourist traffic, the harbour will be important.

The concrete quay wall of the harbour will be 170 yards long. 50,000 cubic feet of earth and stone will reinforce it. So far the work's proceeding well on time. For the Valley Tonga Africans the lake will be a boon. Long before this young shaver grows up he'll live in a proper house. Eventually he may work in the big fishing trade the lake will open up. A minor snag meanwhile is the rapid growth of Salvinia weed, which will choke inshore areas if it's not checked. A nuisance, but not more.
