NEWS CAMERA ON EVENTS IN KOREA

Memorial services are held in a stadium in Seoul, where a monument commemorates those who lost their lives in last year's brief and bloody uprising against the regime of Dr. Syngman Rhee. Weeping during the rites are mothers of the hundred and thirty nine men who were shot down by police in the nation wide demonstrations against what they felt were rigged elections. And at Panmunjom, all but forgotten by the rest of the world, the Joint Military Armistice Commission goes into its eight weary year. Outside the headquarters tension still flares between United Nations and North Korean guards. ....a reminder that this is a truce, not a real peace. For some reason...or no reason at all, a North Korean slaps an American in the face and the fight is on. The battle of the truce compound is quickly over. Total casualties: six North Koreans knocked down.
