

LINO CUTS OF NAZI CRIMES.

Hermann Fechenbach, a German Jew now of British nationality is recording the crimes and horrors of the Hitler regime in a novel way. 20 of his lino cuts have been ordered by Stuttgart Town Council. Hermann is busy at them in his London studio, and they'll be used to illustrate a book dealing with the fate of Jews in Nazi Germany. Ink is rolled over the finished line-cuts, and in that way the artist can take as many copies as he wants. More men should take it up. For interesting the new girl friend, etchings are played out; they might like to see your lino-cuts.

Hermann has been doing this sort of work since he escaped from Germany in 1939. He went on with it while he was interned on the Isle of Man during the war, always hoping that one day his pictures of the Nazi gang would be treasured in Germany. Even the infamous Goering is no more than a name to the new generation; so are most of the others. It's important to remember what these men did; how they persecuted the Jews, then tried to exterminate them, and did destroy the stupendous number of six million. Hermann Fechenbach has earned the gratitude of his race.
