There has to be everything to make it possible to stay down there until the fall-out's dispersed and it's safe to come up. What a marvellous place to play in. Going below when the warning system has given the alarm, there's complete protection against fall out, as soon as father closes the hatch. A shelter like this for four costs £300. When the world war ended we thought we'd seen the last of shelters, which shows just how wrong we were.
