SCIENCE ON THE FARM.

Who'd have thought it possible for 12-hundred cattle to be fed by only two men? It's actually being done in Canada, on a model farm in Quebec Province. From the far west they take Shartherns, Herefords and Aberdeen Angus Cattle, mostly ranging from seven-to-800 pounds in weight. Them, it's over to mechanisation, with all the food mixed and measured automatically. For 100 days there's a high protein diet of haylage and grain.

At the end of the treatment the cattle have increased in weight by anything from 400-to-700 pounds; just the size the market ordered. That is farming, 1962.
