ONE THE HOME FRONT

1. V.S. of barbed wire being placed around government buildings in London and of army guards outside the buildings 27
 2. M.Ss and c.us. of aliens arriving at and ~~not~~ settling in at an internment camp in England for foreign nationals 52
 3. M.Ss. of children at a railway station on the S.E. Coast on the first stage of their evacuation to Wales 20
 4. V.S. of refugees from the lowlands arriving at a port in England by channel ferry and of them being received at reception centre on the dock. Good c.us. of refugee children at the centre 50
 5. G.V. Alexandra Palace - which is being used as a refugee reception centre in London 5
 6. V.S. of refugees resting in the halls of Alexandra Palace and of them being fed and cared for by women volunteers. The refugees are mainly women and children and old people 60
 7. M.Ss. of the Queen inspecting women of the womens ambulance driving brigade in the grounds of Buckingham Palace. The women march past after the inspection followed by the ambulances presented to them by Hollywood Film Stars 46
