EVACUATION OF THE B.E.F GREATEST EPIC OF THE WAR.

A curtain of darkness hangs over the coast of Britain. The dark shadow of ships flash their signals to the shore. As dawn breaks Fathe Gazette's cameraman is on a tiny merchant ship. He is risking his life to bring you these pictures. He is on his way to Dunkirk. Every few seconds he sees other ships returning, ships of all shapes and sizes, manned by sailors and Merchantmen of Britain. Wireless operators are at their posts. Each ship is filled with men of the B.E.F. and of the French Army in Flanders. They are on their way home from the Hell that is Dunkirk. Since these pictures were taken ... we have all heard the full story from the Frime Minister. Of how the Royal Navy, using nearly a thousand ships has brought back nearly three hundred and fifty thousand men. Now you are off burning Dunkirk, now you are to see that evacuation in Progress. You will see the Navy in action, Nazi planes You will see the beaches of Dunkirk under enemy fire ... our own ga overhead. Younwill see the calm waters dotted with hundreds of men guns replying. as they wade or swim out to the ships. Here inpictures is the triumph that turned a major military disaster into a miracle of deliverance. Here in one staggering shot the Allied armies come out from the shore. That one amazing picture sympolizes the miracle of deliverance, which in the words of the Prime Minister, was achieved by valour, by perseverance, by perfect discipline, by skill and unconquerable vitality. All the might of the German Air Force failed to stop them, We beat them back, we got our armies away, and the enemy paid four fold for our losses. And now we're on our way home, the ships are gliding into a British Port the men of the B.E.F. are stepping once again on to British soil.

We shall go on to the end, we shall not fail. We shall fight on the seas and on the oceans, we shall fight in the air. We shall fight on the beaches, in the fields, in the streets, and on the hills, as we fought in blazing Dunkirk. But like the men who smashed their way out....from the hellish beaches of Flanders we shall never surrender.
